It's been a couple years since we've held our Annual Friends Summer Used Book Sale, because of the pandemic, but now we're back! And it's going to be just as BIG and FUN as you remember-tables of books spread out inside and outside at Bayliss Library (weather permitting). The sale starts at 9 a.m. on Friday, July 29, and runs until 4 p.m. Then we'll open again on Saturday, July 30, at 9 a.m. and sell until 1 p.m. The Saturday Special will be \$3.00 per bag of bookspaper, plastic, tote bag, or back pack (excludes Nearly New, Really Recent, and specially-priced items).

We'll have tables full of hardcover and paperback books, lots of puzzles, a variety of interesting magazines, DVDs and a few audio books, all at the bargain price of \$.50 each or 3 for \$1.00. The Nearly-New table will be piled with recent best-sellers, at a great price of \$4.00 each or 2 for \$7.00. We'll have a selection of Really-Recent books for \$2.00 each, and a special table of free books—the ones we'd rather give away than throw away. There will be some special-priced sale items and a good selection of Michigan history and marine books. And remember, the early Bookworms get the best books!

Our Friends-First Early Bird Sale will be held on Thursday, July 28, from 4:30 p.m. to 5:45 p.m.. If your annual Friends of Bayliss dues are paid up, your postcard ticket is included in this newsletter. If you receive the newsletter by e-mail, your postcard ticket is being mailed to you. But it's still not too late to sign up. Dues are only \$15.00 per year and can be paid at the Bayliss Library Circulation Desk. Once paid, you'll be given a postcard ticket for the Friends-First Sale. We've got 2 special offers for the Friends-First Sale: Bring in your Friends of Bayliss tote bag and fill it up for only \$5.00. Or get 1 free hardcover or paperback book. (Offers do not include Nearly New, Really Recent, or specially-priced items.) If you don't have a Friends of Bayliss tote bag, you can buy one at the Bayliss Circulation Desk or at the Friends-First Sale, for only \$10.00. It's our way of saying "Thanks for Being a Friend of Bayliss Library!"

"Cupcakes for Bayliss" Sweets Sale

The 2022 Annual Friends Sweets Sale was another "nobake" sale, but this year we added "Cupcakes" – paper cupcakes, that is. We offered paper cupcakes for a donation of any amount, and pasted the cupcakes to giant hearts displayed on the glass wall by the Friends On-Going Book Sale. And it turned out to be another Sweet Success! We raised \$587.76, without baking anything!

Sabrina Neveu, Bayliss Children's Librarian, designed the cupcakes for us, using a basic cupcake outline and adding a dollop of frosting to the top. She used the Cricut machine (that the Friends purchased for Bayliss) to cut the card-stock base (in red, light pink, and hot pink colors), and then cut the frosting tops out of white copy paper. All we had to do was glue the "frosting" on the "cupcakes", and decorate the giant hearts.

Jeanne Wellington drew (free-hand) and cut out the 3 huge

hearts for us, on newsprint paper. Then Gladys Teske, Ronnie Conboy, Barbara Gruenewald, Barbara Searight, Linda Stoetzer, and Nancy Gillotte "frosted" the cupcakes, decorated the big hearts, and put the display on the glass wall, with much-needed artistic help from Susan Askwith.

We had a donation can at the Circulation Desk, and baskets with the cupcakes, stickers, and markers for decorating. Pretty soon the hearts started filling up with lots of cheery cupcakes! Many, many thanks to all who donated and decorated cupcakes, and supported Bayliss Library!

Author Eugene Milhizer at **Bayliss Library on July 28**

Many of us have read the book "Anatomy of a Murder" and/or have seen the movie, filmed in Marquette and starring James Stewart. Now we can dig deeper into the actual murder mystery when Author Eugene Milhizer presents his new book "Dissecting Anatomy of a Murder: The Author, The Crime, The Novel, and The Film". Mr. Milhizer will be at Bayliss Library on Thursday, July 28, at 6:00 p.m., in the Reading Room area. He will have books available for purchase and signing, after his presentation.

In his book, Milhizer recounts the 1952 murder that took place in Big Bay, Michigan, the high-profile trial, in which John Voelker defended the accused, the book that Voelker authored after the trial (under the pen name Robert Traver), and the production of the subsequent film. It's sure to be an entertaining evening for fans of the book, the film, or any true crime story, especially one that happened close to our back yard.

Eugene Milhizer served as an Army Judge Advocate and held a teaching appointment at the Judge Advocate General's School at the University of Virginia. In 2001, he joined the Ave Maria School of Law faculty, later serving as its president and dean, before returning to teaching. He is now Dean Emeritus Milhizer, after serving as interim president and dean for three month during 2021.

Come hear about the many legal and ethical issues that the actual trial, the book, and the film raised.


